

# No Mow May



No Mow May is one of the easiest ways to help and connect with wildlife, and the perfect way to start supporting nature in your garden (in May and beyond!).

Join in by letting the wildflowers grow and be part of the No Mow Movement.

### But I've already cut the lawn, can I still join in?

Yes! Any time with longer grass will encourage the growth of wildflowers which are great for bees, beetles and other pollinators. Mowing your lawn less frequently can provide enough nectar sugar for ten times the amount of pollinators.

Longer lawns offer birds the perfect foraging spots especially when there are plenty of wildflowers in amongst the grass.

## Won't I kill all the insects when I cut at the end of May?

If you can leave some areas long for insects to live in (maybe at one edge of the lawn) then it will certainly help them to survive through June and beyond. However, any extra nectar is good for hungry bees and butterfies, so if you can only do No Mow May it is still a good way to begin to help the wildlife in your garden.

At Hucclecote, we will <u>doing</u> No Mow May with the grass in front of church as part of our commitment to looking after God's creation through Eco Church. Keep your eyes peeled: perhaps another orchid will pop up this year!

## **Any other Business**

**Church letting** Barry has been approached by the leaders of a community of orthodox Christians from the Indian State of Kerala asking if they could use our church building to hold Christian Communion Services on a Sunday afternoon. Barry wanted to gauge the opinions of Church

members. The following was discussed:

- The group would wish to either screen off or cover the Communion table
- The group have asked if they could use our kitchen facilities as they serve food after their communion services
- The group have asked if there is somewhere where they can store items. It was suggested tidying up and recycling the old hymn books in the Choir vestry.
- Income the amount charged for rent would need to factor in the use of the heating of the church during the winter months
- If the group wished to use the sound system then they would have to leave it in the same position they found it in and not alter it. Similarly with the organ, there would need to be procedures agreed for the use of the organ
- Any cover or screen used to hide the Communion table would need to be funded by the group.
- It was suggested asking other churches in the Circuit who have rented out their churches to other faith groups to let us have a copy of their proposal so we can adjust it according to what is agreed between both parties.
- The group have 30/40 attending although this could increase
- The group must have public liability insurance
- We would need to review their safeguarding policy
- It was suggested photographs of the layout of the church are placed in the vestry so the group can put everything back afterwards
- The Circuit will need to agree to this, Barry will take this proposal to the staff meeting.
- No alcohol would be allowed on the premises
- There would have to be a trial period and then a review carried out. Following discussions, the Church members agreed to Barry and the Church Stewards taking this proposal forward. **Size of banners proposal** It was agreed to take this proposal to the next Church Council Mark advised that we need to arrange a date for a church tidy up.

**Lay Worker appointment** Barry advised the advert is ready to be published and the interview date is being arranged.

Letting of Church premises for an interfaith event Jane Jackson has received an enquiry regarding letting the church buildings for an interfaith event. Jane was unable to attend the meeting and it was suggested the proposal is brought to the Church Council for consideration. There was a report on the BBC news regarding the recent theft from the Welcome Garden. Sheila Pugh asked about the Church finances. The Church Treasurer, John Rainbow, had provided a report for the annual meeting. The church finances are in a healthy position. Mark reported the Grants sub-Committee had met and we need to have a project to be agreed on before we can apply for grants. Quotations are being obtained to improve the church heating. It was suggested having a gift day and to raise money for a specific project or to purchase a tangible item, for example Members could purchase a radiator etc. The focus would be to hold the Gift Day in November around the time of the Church Anniversary. It was suggested letting members know that any items donated, the church could receive 25% in gift aid.
