From the Welcome Gardeners



It has been a mixed summer in the Welcome Garden. The weather has been too hot to produce any runner beans that anyone would enjoy eating. Climbing French beans have been more edible, though not at all prolific but dwarf French beans are doing much better. Courgettes and squashes gave up completely. However, onions, garlic, potatoes, beetroot and damsons have been successful and the kale and Swiss Chard (our winter crops) are getting going under our new protection tunnel.

We delivered the crops in the photo to the Gloucester Windrush Food Venture at their base in the All Nations Community Centre at the end of August. A

small group of volunteers cooks and delivers a meal every Thursday to 90+ people in Gloucester - mainly people of West Indian origins. They were thrilled to receive our produce and we enjoyed growing it all.

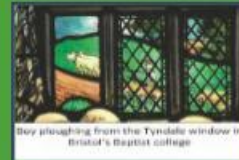
If you would like to join us to garden and chat on Wednesday mornings we meet from 10am until 12 - but always stop for a break in the Welcome Café at 11am.

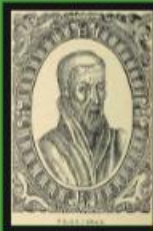

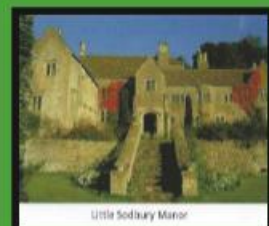
This year marks the 500th anniversary of Tyndale's translation of the Greek New Testament into the English vernacular affecting our language even today
