Re-invitation of Rev John McNeill

The Circuit Assembly was pleased to receive confirmation that Rev Dr John McNeill has been re-invited to serve in the Circuit for a further five years from September 2027. The other two re-invitations from the same date were also received by the Assembly: Rev Michelle Ireland for a further five years, and Deacon Sue Peat for two more years.

There have been further discussions within the Circuit Executive and the District about the one Circuit appointment which will go into the Stationing Process which have led to an adjustment to John's section. This will now be called the City Centre Section and comprise Churchdown, Hucclecote (supported by Gary), St Oswald's and Pastoral Lead at St John's (part of a team ministry with Revd Jayne Webb as Project Lead and Deacon Sue Peat in her City Centre Mission role)

John will occupy the city-centre manse at Estcourt Close from a date to be confirmed.

Harvest Festival

Our Harvest Festival service will be held on 4th October and led by our Minister Rev Dr John McNeill. We will be accepting gifts of fresh produce, and tinned goods. (We will confirm specific items the Food Bank require the week before the service). You can bring your gifts to church the week before, or present them during the service.

Fresh produce will be donated to various food hubs in Gloucester where we already donate produce from the Welcome Garden, and tinned goods will go to Gloucester Foodbank.

We also want to show our concern for the victims of the recent earthquake in Venezuela and the mud slide in Nepal so we will have a retiring collection for Christian Aid at the end of the service.

There will be a hunger lunch after the Harvest service (soup and a roll). Dietary requirements will be catered for, and we hope as many people as possible can stay for lunch.

Lunch Club is on 2nd and 4th Friday of the month. We currently have about 25 regular diners, and it's such a lovely time for people to meet and dine with others. They are a friendly bunch, and most appreciative of the food and friendship.

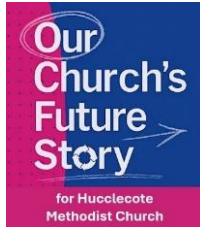

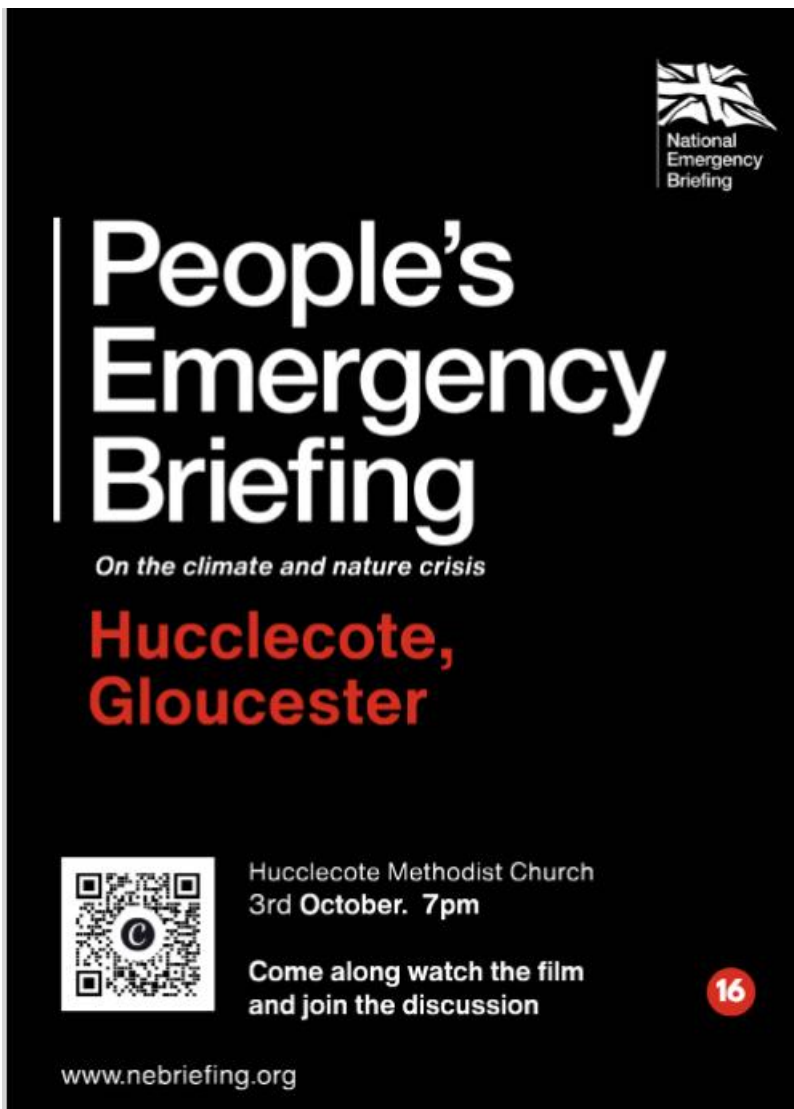

Screening of the People's Emergency Briefing Film 3rd October 7pm



The National Emergency Briefing (NEB) calls on the UK government to give a national televised briefing on the climate and nature crisis.

A Westminster event was held in November 2025 in Methodist Central Hall. It featured leading experts who briefed an invited audience of over 1,200 politicians and leaders from business, culture, faith, sport and the media. The briefing set out the implications of climate and nature breakdown for health, food systems, national security and the economy.

A compelling documentary film, the People's Emergency Briefing, has since been produced. It contains footage of that event and is being screened across the nation including by many churches. It aims to support a parliamentary call for a televised briefing and educate people of the full scale of the crisis and show what the response needs to be.

Why is our church hosting a screening?

The Methodist Church, together with other churches, has historically played an important role at times of national crisis. From providing much needed pastoral care, being a place of refuge as well as challenging the government of the day on

issues of justice and morality. The Joint Public Issues Team (including the Methodist church) has called for all churches to host a screening if they can.

The climate crisis is both a global threat and a national one and, as the film makes clear, it affects every aspect of society.. There is clear evidence that emergency action will strengthen our national and economic resilience and improve lives. The National Emergency Briefing is designed to help create a societal tipping point towards the genuine emergency action now needed.

As Christians our concern is underpinned not just by the threat to our own interests but by core Christian principles of caring for God's creation, Jesus' command to love one another and responding to human need. While the climate crisis will affect all of us, it is important to remember it is the poorest communities in the world who are most impacted and least equipped to deal with the consequences. The NEB aims to further strengthen global action through the leadership of the UK's response.
