Local Arrangement Service - Follow Up

Postcards for your MP

In our Creationtide service on Sunday, we were given the challenge of writing a postcard to our MP expressing our concern for creation. This was in response to our readings on the theme of hope and action, but also to a call from the <u>Joint Public Issues Team</u> (JPIT) to join with the Climate Coalition in their <u>Lobby week</u>. (JPIT is a partnership between the Methodist Church, the Baptist Union of Great Britain, and the United Reformed Church to help the Chu rches work together for peace and justice, including by speaking and acting on public policy issues. The Climate Coalition is the UK's largest coalition of over 130 environmental and humanitarian organizations, faith groups and charities dedicated to taking action on the climate and nature crises.)

We were asked to write about one environmental issue (for example loss of nature, or the need to transition away from the use of fossil fuels). If you were not in the service but would still like to respond, these are the things that need to be on your postcard:

- Your name and full address (so that your MP can check that you are in their constituency).
- Your MP's name
- Why you are concerned about the environment (for example as a grandparent worried about
 the future for your grandchildren, as part of your faith, or because you are concerned about
 the effects of air pollution on your or someone else's health). This will help to make your
 message more personal.
- Which particular issue you are concerned about, why and what you would like your MP to do about it. (Some ideas to help are here.)

If you have a completed postcard, please return it to Beth by Sunday 12th so that she can pass it on to your MP.

Christmas Shoe Boxes

CHRISTMAS SHOE BOX PRESENTS FOR THE UNDER PRIVILEGED CHILDREN OF GLOUCESTER AGED 0 – 14 years

As you know we have for some years organised shoe box presets for the under privileged children in Gloucester. The Salvation Army very kindly distribute them, because they are able to identify children in need.

If you would like to help with this, please can your contributions be brought to Church before 15th November. The boxes will be blessed in Church on the 16th November and forwarded to The Salvation Army in time for distribution for Christmas.

Shoe boxes (not boot/trainers/lge men's please) should be labelled Boy or Girl and approx age. Some boxes will go to the Refugee Centres, so items such as toiletries and underwear will be very useful.

This is a Christmas present, so <u>please include some toys and/or other items of fun including sweets.</u> (Avoid chocolate because it can melt and spoil box contents).

Other suggested items could include:

Hat/Gloves/Scarf, hairbrush/comb, toothbrush/paste (age appropriate), bubble bath/soap, flannel/wash sponge/scrunchie. Colouring book/colouring pencils, magic painting book/paintbrush, reading books & puzzles. Plain paper pads/pencils, diarys, calculators, fancy key rings, hair slides etc. are all good for older children.

For baby boxes, please check suitability, especially toys and do not include sweets. However, baby clothes, nappies and baby toiletries are good choices.

If possible, the box should be wrapped in Christmas paper and secured with an elastic band. It must be able to be opened for checking contents to ensure everything is appropriate. If you are unable to do this, please leave the box unwrapped and just secure it with an elastic band.

If you are unable to supply/fill a box, we would be glad to receive items which we can add to boxes.

Thank you for your generosity in supporting this worthwhile venture.
